

Safety and the Parker Centre

The Centre will actively work to ensure that all hazards associated with its work are identified, assessed and controlled.

Identifying hazards in the workplace and developing safe work practices is a process requiring training and experience.

1. Seek the opinions of more experienced colleagues from across the Parker Centre.
2. Ensure you receive ongoing formal and informal training in managing safety in your workplace. Talk to your immediate supervisor about this aspect of your personal development training.
3. Read the Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS) before using any new substance and incorporate the information into your work practices.
4. Report all accidents and incidents, no matter how trivial, to your supervisor or safety representative.
5. Use the Parker Centre management to inform fellow researchers across the Centre of your safety-related experiences. It may save a life or a limb!
